1821

Thursday se'nnight dies in peace with all mankind, at an advanced age, J. Nalder, Esq. of Berwick Bassett. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 11 June 1821

1825

On Saturday sen'night was married at Sutton Benger, R. Nalder, Esq. of Berwick Bassett, to Miss Margaret Joanna Russ Spackman. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 27 June 1825

1826

Died on Sunday, at an advanced age, Mrs. Nalder, of Berwick Bassett, in this county, relict of the late J. Nalder Esq. Hampshire Chronicle, Monday, 9 January 1826

1828

Wednesday was married at Ramsbury, by the Rev. E. Meyrick, DD, the Rev. Thomas Hawkins of Sherston, to Sarah, daughter of the late John Nalder, Esq. of Berwick Bassett

1835

July 11, at Berwick Bassett, after a lingering illness, Mrs. Susannah Whitehouse, wife of Mr. Samuel Whitehouse, formerly of Devizes, pawnbroker Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 20 July 1835 also Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday, 16 July 1835

1842

Married, on the 11th instant at the parish church of Berwick Bassett, Wilts, by the Rev. Charles Brodie Cooper, the Rev. Robert Cooper, youngest son of Edward Cooper, Esq., of Staverton, Wilts, to Elizabeth, eldest daughter and co-heiress of the late John Nalder, Esq, of Berwick Bassett.
