

Post Office Directory Extract 1867 Berwick St. James



BERWICK ST. JAMES, a township, parish and village, 8 mile north-west from Salisbury, and 106 from London, in the Hundred of Branch and Dole, and Wilton Union, South Wilts; the population in 1851, was 904, extending over 2,942 acres. Lord Ashburton is lord of the manor. The living is a vicarage, value £54, in the gift of Lord Ashburton; the Rev. Charles Lawford, M.A., incumbent. The church is in the early English style, with Norman square tower and 5 bells; it is dedicated to St. James. Two miles west are the entrenchments called Yarnborough Castle.

ISHERTON is a quarter of a mile north-east; Uppington, half a mile south.

Letters are received through Wilton. The nearest money order office is at Salisbury
