

Kellys Directory Extract 1867 Bowerchalke



BOWER CHALKE is a parish and village, in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Chalke, Wilton union, Salisbury county court district, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury and rural deanery of Chalke, 10 miles southwest from Salisbury, and 94 from London. The church of the Holy Trinity is a small cruciform building, with square tower and 3 bells. The register dates from about 1750. The living is a vicarage, annual value £100, annexed to the vicarage of Broad Chalke, in the gift of King's College, Cambridge, and held since by the Rev Rowland Williams, D.D. of that college; the Rev. John Owen, is curate. There is a National school, supported by the Earl of Pembroke. Bowerchalke appears to have been the site of a Roman camp, and on the downs are barrows. The Earl of Pembroke is lord of the manor, and sole landowner. The soil is chalk and a little green sand; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley and oats. The population in 1861 was 496; area, 2,966 acres.

QUIDHAM STREET is half a mile west; Woodmington, a mile and a half south-west; Marlycombe, half a mile south; Knoyle a mile and a half south-east; Vernditch, 2 miles south-east.
