ST MARTIN'S CHURCH FABRIC NEWS

A lot of work needs to be done to the Church. Here are just some of the projects planned. The external stone and lead work are in poor condition. The pointing of the east wall requires patching, the metal window struts are splitting the stone, the bell tower has a long standing bramble growing out of it and there are two significant leaks affecting the roof. The ventilation of the inside of the Church needs significant improvement, requiring two opening windows and ventilation from the bell tower. The north wall is damp as a result of leaks and poor ventilation, leading to damage to the large painting on that wall. The gate at the west end of the Church has disintegrated and needs to be replaced. We need a new notice board to face the village square and the war memorial requires to be cleaned so the names can be read. It is likely that the cost of these works will be of the order of £12000.

All the above needs to be completed before we contemplate further improvements to the interior of the church. Future plans will allow the church to be used as a flexible community facility. We will give you updates over the next months.

BREMHILL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The response to the Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire was 47% which exceeded our expectations. Thank you for taking the time to complete the questionnaire. Richard Tucker designed a spreadsheet which has now been completed, and the results will be posted on the Bremhill website in September. This will be the start of the consultation process, so please view the results and pass any comments to the Chairman Ian James via email ijamesconsulting@aol.com or to your parish councillor. The steering group will arrange three meetings at each of the parish village halls in October where the Neighbourhood Plan will be presented, and discussions can take place on any additions you may wish to see entered into the document.

A business questionnaire was designed by the team, and has been distributed. We believe that businesses need to be sustainable, and where possible people should be able to live and work in the parish.

The Parish Council and the steering group have also completed a Landscape Report for the Council to allow them to assess each of the options for future development in and around Chippenham. The questionnaire responses have clearly made the statement that Bremhill should remain a rural parish which is unspoilt and that the rural buffer between Chippenham town and Tytherton Lucas should be preserved. If option C is approved by the Council then Chippenham 2020 will put in a planning application to build 2,700 homes at New Leaze Farm in the Parish of Bremhill.

The coming months are likely to be the most important for the Parish of Bremhill. A great deal rests on whether the parish loses good farmland, the rural buffer and the beauty of the Marden and Avon valleys to concrete. In addition the Council will adjust the settlement boundary to annexe New Leaze farm and other land to the east of Chippenham to be part of Chippenham town. This change of boundary should also be resisted.

Your support will be needed to oppose any such development when the Council moves to the consultation phase of the revised core strategy in the autumn if option C is adopted by the Council.

Thank you for supporting the Neighbourhood Plan.

FIRST WORLD WAR COMMEMORATIONS

The editors would like commemorate those from the Bremhill Parish who died during the First World War. David Wood has done a lot of research about these individuals from a number of sources, including the War Graves Commission. The Newsletter would like to publish this research on the anniversary of their deaths over the next four years. However, we are aware that some families may not wish us to do this, certainly without consultation. If this applies to you, please get in touch with the editors as soon as possible. You may well be able to provide us with information or photographs which would personalise our entry. Alfred Tuck, who was born in Bremhill, but does not appear on any of the War Memorials in the Parish, died in November 1914. We propose to publish his biography in the November Edition.

Once David has completed the biographies, they will be presented to the local communities and Churches in Bremhill Parish to compliment the local memorials.

The following inscription is found in St Martin's Church, Bremhill. Many of these names are also on a similar inscription in St John the Baptist Church, Foxham.

WILTSHIRE FIRE & RESCUE SERVICE

Consultation starts into future of Fire & Rescue Service

A wide ranging consultation to consider options for the future of Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service started on Monday (21 July). Between now and 20th October, local people will be able to have their say on options including closer working with local authorities and the police through to a possible merger with Dorset Fire Authority.

Local residents will be able to access further information and complete an online questionnaire. In addition, a random selection of 12,000 households across Wiltshire and Dorset will receive the questionnaire directly. Information will also be placed in public buildings and libraries. Simon Routh-Jones, Chief Fire Officer of Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service, said: "We are keen to know what local people think about our options to strengthen our fire and rescue service. We have a number of potential ways forward, including a potential merger with Dorset Fire Authority... and we would encourage any views as no decisions have yet been made."

Cllr Christopher Devine, Chairman of Wiltshire & Swindon Fire Authority, said: "We face difficult financial times ahead that result from cuts to our central Government grant. We need to find significant savings from our limited budget whilst protecting frontline services. It is vital that local people take this opportunity to find out more about the proposals and have their say."

BLIND SAILING WEEK

In Late June, 28 sailing yachts started making their way to Falmouth, some from as far away as Southampton and Lymington, taking them down the coast of Hampshire, Dorset and Cornwall to the Royal Cornish Yacht club, hosts to Blind Sailing Week. Four of the sighted sailors who hosted blind crew for the week on two of the boats were from the land locked Bremhill area!

George and Jophy Powell on their 33ft boat 'Wishwell', accompanied by John Harris from Spirthill, hosted two blind crew. Rosie Stevens, her first time with the fleet as a crew member on a charter boat, guided a man who was not only blind but deaf as well. How do you communicate with someone who can't hear or see you might ask? - well Rosie speedily writes by touch on the palm of his hand and he understands every word - something which earned the admiration of everyone who came to the event.

The attending yachts are split into several fleets who visit local yacht havens within daily sailing distance eg. Salcombe, Newton Ferrers, Plymouth, and the upper reaches of the River Fal. This is after each blind crew member has had a 'touch and feel' tour of the boat and its equipment and a full safety briefing, including man over board drill.

On the penultimate day the yachts sail back to Falmouth for a dinner and presentation at which skippers are presented with a plaque for participation and an elected blind member of each fleet gives a speech (usually hilarious) reporting on their experiences for the week. As they are quick to tell you they like to be challenged, many learning to sail by the feel of wind direction on their face, having been set a course then steering by hearing compass.

The Blind Week charity has been running for nearly 30 years, hosted in Falmouth one year and then Southampton the next. One of the founding members is George Powell who along with like minded sighted sailors provide a valuable holiday and escape to less fortunate people who are visually impaired but love the sea and are prepared to take on the team challenge of sailing a yacht.

END OF AN ERA IN FOXHAM.

Whatever the reason for the demise of Hatts coaches, it is sad to see the end of a business which has operated in Foxham for approaching a hundred years. We all feel sorry for both Michael and Adrian Hillier, grandson and great grandson of Bill Hatt who started the business as a cattle haulier in 1928. We feel for those employees who found themselves without a job and for those who were looking forward to going on holiday with Hatts this summer.

As I mentioned above, Hatts started as a livestock haulier not long after my father moved to farm at Stockham Marsh and I am sure his lorry would have carried livestock for my father to and from local markets. I can remember when, during the war, Bill Hatt had a Buick car for hire. Very few families had their own cars, so we would use him if we needed to visit relations who lived further away than our trusted pony and trap could take us.

During the war my father used to hire a bus from Hatts to run a regular service to Chippenham on Friday market day so that other farmers and wives of farm workers could go to town for their weekly shop. He would collect the fares and pay for the hire of the bus.

Hatts coaches have also taken many generations of children from the village to both the local primary school and to the senior schools in Chippenham. Daphne often talks of the time when Jane started at primary school. On the first day it was all new and she was happy to go to school on the bus. However, the second day it was different; she had done that once and that was enough! She screamed and refused to walk onto the bus but Nelson, who was driving, said in his quiet manner "Put her on someone's lap and she will be alright. We get one every term!"

Over the years Hatts have generously supported many events in the village, most recently the Tytherton ride and the Foxham horse show. We now wait to see what becomes of the site, which we hope will be sympathetically developed. Whatever happens, I hope that the name of Hatts can be retained.

THE NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING TEAM

You may have seen us out and about again this month doing speed checks at a variety of locations in our rural areas. In Goatacre, cold callers laid a quantity of tarmac, charging £2500. Trading standards offences were committed, as all callers must give a 14 day cooling off period prior to work commencing. Please beware of such callers. It is always best to use a reputable company.

Please take registration numbers of unfamiliar vehicles and send them through to me. Anything you see that is suspicious, please call us .

We are still hungry for Community Speed Watch volunteers. It is extremely worthwhile and helps to make drivers aware of the speed that they are travelling through our villages, as well as offending drivers receiving letters from the Police. Please contact me if you think you may be able to assist. It is a simple process. Full training is given and you get to use the same type of speed gun that we use in the Police.
