**1812**

Died in Baker Street, Portman Square, London, aged 58, the Rev. W. Cole, late rector of Broadchalk, Wilts. **Jackson's Oxford Journal Saturday, 26 December 1812**

**1814**

Tuesday was married at Kersey, the Rev. Stephen Hawtry, Vicar of Broad Chalke, Wilts. to Marianne, only daughter of the late Mr. Thomas Bennet, of the same place. **The Ipswich Journal Saturday, 1 January 1814**

**1819**

Married, Mr. Sidford of Broad Chalke, Wilts. to Miss Elizabeth Rich of Tetbury. **Jackson's Oxford Journal Saturday, 12 June 1819**

**1840**

On Monday, June 3, at Broad Chalk, by the Rev. A Chapman, Mr. Jacob King, keeper to T. King, Esq., of Alvediston, to Miss Ann Scammell, eldest daughter of Mr. John Scammell, of the same place. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 8 June 1840**

**1842**

Died on Tuesday last at his residence in Fittleton, the Rev. Thomas Horner South, aged 80. He was seventeen years Curate of the parish, and for more than twenty years Curate of the parishes of Broad Chalke, Bower Chalke and also of Teffont, in this county. Mr. South was extensively known and very much respected through a long life. He was a descendant of the family of Horner, of Mells, Somersetshire, and also of the noble house of Ilchester. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 3 January 1842**

Married, Mr. W. Parsons of Andover to Elizabeth, youngest daughter of the late Mr. John Stevens of Broad Chalke, near Salisbury. **The Bristol Mercury Saturday, 31 December 1842**

**1847**

Died, Oct 16, at Bower Chalke, Charlotte Bracher, aged 55 years. She had been a faithful and respected servant in the employment of Mr. Harford, of Broad Chalke, for the last eighteen years. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 6 November 1847**

**1849**

Died, on the 5th instant, greatly respected, Mr. Selfe, of Knighton Farm, Broad Chalk, aged 59. **Hampshire Advertiser & Salisbury Guardian, Saturday, 10 March 1849**
