

Death of Mr. F. W. Culley

After a very long illness, which he had borne with extreme courage, the death occurred on Thursday of Mr. Frederick Walter Culley, of North End, at the age of 44 years. A son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Walter Culley, he had been employed at Messrs. C. and T. Harris for 20 years until his illness compelled him to give up work. He joined up during the last war in the 4th Wilts, but was invalided out with rheumatic fever. Twenty years ago he married Miss Waite, of Chippenham, who survives him and there are two sons and a daughter. Mr. Culley was a very energetic member of the committee of the Calne Football Club. The funeral took place at Holy Trinity Cemetery on Monday, the Rev. C. Tyzack officiating. The immediate mourners were Mrs. Cully (widow), Messrs. John and Edward Culley (sons), Messrs. R. and E. Culley (brothers), Mesdames Woollard and Earle (sisters), Mr. T. House, of Chippenham (nephew). Mr. C. Lane (representing the Calne Conservative Club), Mr. B. Ponting (representing the Calne Football Club) and Mr. R. Burchell (representing Messrs. L. and O. Hawkins), Messrs. T. Cleverley, S. Stephens, A. Puffet, and W. Richens (employees of Messrs. C. and T. Harris (Calne) Ltd.), acted as bearers. Amongst a large number of floral tributes were wreaths from Messrs. C and T. Harris and the neighbours.
