

Is a parish 3 miles south of Badminton railway station, 6 miles north west from Chippenham and 6 north from Corsham, in the Chippenham Division of Wiltshire, Petty Sessional Division, Union and County Court District of Chippenham, and Diocese of Bristol. The Church of St. Andrew is a building of stone in the Early English and Perpendicular styles, with a register dating from the year 1653. The living is a rectory, and is in the gift of Mrs. W. J. Lysley, and held by the Rev. F. L. Appleford, M.A. In the village is a Congregational Church. There is a fine specimen of the market cross, consisting of a square stone pedestal raised upon two steps and ornamented with sunk quarterfoiled panels, bearing shields and roses alternatively; from this springs a slender shaft capped by a finial; at each angle of the platform is a massive stone pier, about six feet high, supporting the wooden lintels of a pyramid roof, covered with tiles. On the Castle Hill are the remains of a British encampment and the ruins of a castle built in the reign of Henry II. The Fossway, the great Roman road, skirts the north western limit of the Manor. The village itself is one of the prettiest in the county. Mrs. Lysley is Lady of the Manor. Area , 1,492 acres; rateable value, £1,489; population in 1921, 383.
