Before Mr Whitmarsh at Lushill in the parish of Castle Eaton, on the body of George Ponting Cullum, between 10 and 11 years of age. Deceased had come down stairs at 5 o'clock in the morning to go to his work as usual, when he became sick, and was unable to leave home. His mother thought it was a bilious attack, and that he would recover without sending for a doctor. In the evening of the same day she went to his bed to see how he was, and found him dead. It was the opinion of a medical gentleman that deceased might have died from the rupture of a vessel in the head, and probably occasioned from vomiting in a natural way. Verdict – Visitation of God.
