Probate Notice on the Estate of Mr. John Hampson Jones

Probate of the will and codicils has been granted and probate duty has been paid on £399,150 15s 11d as the value of the personal estate of Mr John Hampson Jones, of Kempsford Manor, Gloucester, and 15 Lowndes Square, who died at Weymouth on the 6th December last. The testator bequeaths to Mr R H Joyson and Mr W E Joyson the objects of art which belonged to the late Mr R Hampson, and he bequeaths to Colonel D B Monck £10,000, his plate, pictures and furniture, household effects, horses and carriages; to John Berkley Monck and Emelia Monck £1000 each; to Cecil J Cockayne Maunsell £2,000; to Caroline Beatrix, Isabel and Ida Maunsell £1000 each; to Emily Elizabeth Gaddum £5000;

To the Rev Charles Reay Pughe of Castle Eaton £2000; in trust for Mrs Florence Pughe wife of the Rev C R Pughe and her issue £50,000; in trust to the testator's reputed son, John Charles Jones and his issue £16,000; to the testator's cousin Mr Richard Clifford Smith £10,000; to Mr Thomas Lawrence Reid, Colonel Richard Lynch Staunton, Mr Oliver Humphrey Foster of Cirencester, Mr Edward Stanley Ormerod, Mr Edward Lockwood Yorke, and to Mr Thomas Browning of Booth Street, Manchester (the testator's agent) £1000 each; to his butler and footman £150 each; and legacies to other servants. A sum of £525 in Birkenhead Railway Stock, part of the property of the testator's late wife, is to be in trust for Frederick William Lawrence hart Cavendish and Elizabeth Mary Cecilia Cavendish; and he bequeaths to the vicar and church wardens of Kempsford for charitable purposes £1000; Manchester Royal Infirmary £1000; St Mary's Hospital, Manchester £500; Salford and Pendleton Hospital £300; Brompton Hospital for Diseases of Chest £500; Fulham Hospital for Cancer £500; Ormond Street Hospital for Sick Children £500; Convalescent Home, Orme Square £500; Fairford Cottage Hospital £500; St George's Hospital £500. Mr Hampson Jones leaves all the residue of his property, real and personal, in equal shares to his cousins, Mr Richard Hampson Joynson and Mr Edward Walter Joynson,

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
