



CHILTON FOLIATT, a parish on the borders of the county adjoining Berks, partly in the Hundred of Kintbury Eagle, Berks, and partly in the Hundred of Kingwardstone, in this county, Hungerford Union, 2 ½ miles north-west of Hungerford, 64 from London, and 9 east of Marlborough, containing a population of 748, with 1,307 acres of land; it is delightfully situated in a vale, well watered by the river Kennet. The fine wooded park of Littlecott, the seat of F. L. Popham, Esq., also Chilton House, a fine red brick mansion, are worthy of notice. The church of St. Mary, with small square tower and modern clock, is in good repair; the interior is very nicely fitted, the pulpit, reading-desk, the organ gallery, and the whole of the seats are of polished oak; the chancel contains several monuments belonging to the Popham family; the window exhibits various figures in stained glass, and the flooring is composed of some rare specimens of glazed pottery, in squares; south of the altar is an effigy in ancient armour, in a recumbent position. The living is a rectory, in the archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury, in the patronage of E. W. L. Popham, Esq., valued at £750; the incumbent is the Rev. John Leyborne Popham, M,A., whose residence adjoins the church. The Wesleyans have a small chapel here, and there is a National school.

LEVERTON is a hamlet. Old and New Hayward, and Park, are farms.

Post Office – Thomas Smith, receiver. Letters arrive from Hungerford, delivered at 8 a.m.; dispatched 7 p.m. The nearest money order office is at Hungerford.
