Collingbourne Ducis



Collingbourne Ducis (or Lower Collingbourne) is a parish 3 miles north-west from Ludgershall in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Elstub, union of Pewsey, county court district of Marlborough, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts and rural deanery of Marlborough, situated on the river Bourne. The adjunct of Ducis is derived from having once been parcel of the Duchy of Lancaster.

The church of St Andrew is an ancient edifice of flint and stone, and consists of chancel, nave and castellated tower containing 5 bells. The chancel was rebuilt by the Rev. W C Lukis, M.A., a former rector. The register dates from 1640. The living is a rectory, yearly value £716, with residence, in the gift of the Marquis of Ailesbury, and held by the Rev. John Dryden Hodgson, M.A., of St Peter's College, Cambridge, rural dean.

There is a handsome National school, of white brick and stone, built by the Marquis of Ailesbury.

The Rev. Charles Francis bequeathed the sum of £100, the interest of which to be appropriated to the repairs of the church. The late Mr George Hooper bequeathed in 1858 £100, the interest of which is applied in distributing coats to aged widows in the parish, and Mr Hooper in 1865, left £100, the interest for blankets.

There are a great number of barrows on the down, south of the parish. Many ancient British relics have been found here.

The Marquis of Ailesbury is lord of the manor and principal landowner.

The soil is gravelly loam; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat and barley.

The area is 3,381 acres; gross estimated rental, £3,465 5s; rateable value, £3,024; and the population in 1871 was 485.
