Made 3rd May 1622 - proved 9th December 1625

Weak in body but .. of good remembrance.

- Body to be buried in the churchyard of Collingbourne and soul .. to ..God ..beseeching him to pardon my sins and to wash them in the blood of his son Christ and that they may never come in remembrance against me that all my transgressions being razed with the righteousness of Christ Jesus I may upon my departure be received up into glory.
- And for my goods moveable and unmoveable .. to my wife Christian Say to enjoy and use them for her own use and comfort so long as she shall live and after her death to dispose them as she shall think meet.
