## **Edgar Walter CUFF**

Edgar Walter Cuff was born in Dinton & his birth was registered in the district of Wilton, Wiltshire in the March quarter of 1899.

(In the 1901 Census, Edgar cannot be located. His parents George & Eliza Cuff are recorded living at Hindon Rd, Dinton with 4 children – aged between 9yrs down to 3yrs none of them being Edgar)

The 1911 Census records Edgar Cuff as a 12 year old boarder, living with Sarah Lane, a 57 year old shopkeeper/grocer & her 3 adult children in a 10 roomed dwelling. The postal address was given as "Grocer etc Dinton, Salisbury". (Edgar's mother – Eliza was recorded as a widowed housekeeper, living at the Keeper's House at Compton Chamberlayne).

Private Edgar Walter Cuff, service number TR/8/9643, was enlisted with the 35<sup>th</sup> Training Reserve of the Hampshire Regiment.

He died on 11<sup>th</sup> May, 1917 of pneumonia, aged 18 years. Pte Cuff is buried in the Churchyard of St Mary's Dinton, Wiltshire and is acknowledged with a Commonwealth War Graves Headstone. His headstone can be located on the West Boundary, south-west of the Church.

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission lists Pte E W Cuff as the son of Eliza Cuff of Compton Chamberlayne and the late George Cuff.

Pte Edgar Cuff did not enter a Theatre of War.
