

Compton Chamberlayne In The News -from Australia

AUSTRALIAN GRAVES ABROAD

Information is sought by "Overseas" regarding the number of soldiers' graves in the United Kingdom. A recent publication gave the total as 2,209. The largest number of graves is at Brookwood, Surrey, where 352 Australians were buried. The list also includes Tidworth Military Cemetery, 161; St. John the Evangelist, Sutton Veny, 144; Durrington, 141; Harefield, 109; Melcombe Regis, Weymouth, 83; Netley Military, 44; Plymouth, 46; St. George's, Fovant, 44; St. Mary's, Codford, 31; Wandsworth, 33; Stratford-Sub-Castle, Salisbury, 26; St. Edith's, Baverstock, 29; Lodge Hill, Birmingham, 53; Nunhead, 24; Norwich, 23; Leighterton, 23; Compton Chamberlayne, Dinton, 28; Cambridge, 21; Arno's Vale, Bristol, 20; Brighton, 27. There are the graves of five Australian nurses and 40 men of the Australian fleet, the latter including 11 at Dalmeny, South Queensferry.
