THIRD † The sum of Fifty Pounds left by
Mr. David Feltham upon trust to the Poor of
the Parish of Coombe Bissett the Interest of
which to be applied in the purchase of Bread to
be distributed by the Vicar and Churchwardens of

the aforesaid Parish in such manner as they shall think proper on the 1st Day of December for ever

FOURTH † The sum of One hundred Pounds left by
Miss Elizabeth and Miss Margaret Fleetwood on Trust
to the aged Poor of the Parish of Coombe Bissett the Interest
of which to be applied in the purchase of Coal to be distri-
