The Manor of Corsham, in the County of Wilts – To witt

At the Court Leet and view of ffrankpledge with the Court Baron of Paul Methuen Esqr. Lord of the said Manor thereheld the twenty ffirst Day of ffirst Day of October in the twenty ninth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the third by the Grace of God of Great Britain ffrance and Ireland King Defender of the ffaithand so forth and in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Eighty nine. Before Henry Merewether Gent Steward there it is (amongst other things) thus inrolled.

At this Court came William Archard Tenant of this Manor by Copy of Court Roll and in full Court here according to the Custom of the said Manor **Did** surrender into the hands of the Lord of the same Manor **All** that Cottage or Tenement and three patches or parcels of Garden Ground situate at Moor-Green in the Parish of Corsham aforesaid containing by Estimation Ten Luggs or perches (be the same more or lefs) and adjoining to a Messuage or Garden of James Cox now in the pofsefsion of the said William Archard To the use and Behoof of the said James Cox his heirs and Afsigns in ffee for ever according to the Custom of the Manor aforesaid **Upon** which at this same Court came the said James Cox and according to the Custom of the said Manor gives to the Lord for a ffine for the Cottage sd. And for the Land sd. Is admitted Tenant and hath done his ffealty.

Examined and agrees with the Court Rools of the sd. Manor By Hen: Merewether Stewd.

I having sold my House and Gardens at Moore Green now in my own Occupation to Mr. James Cox of Corsham in the County of Wilts Baker do hereby attorn Tenent to the said James Cox for the same at the yearly Rent of one pound and ten shillings from Lady Day 1787 to be paid at four equal quarterly Payments at Midsummer Michaelmas Christmas and Lady Day the first Payment thereof to be made at Midsummer next
