

The Mausoleum at Bowood House

Funeral of the Marquis of Lansdowne

At mid-day, on Thursday last, of the late Lord Lansdowne were consigned to their last earthly resting place, in the Mausoleum in Bowood Park. It was intended that the funeral should have been strictly private, and in accordance with the wish no invitations were issued; but several of his lordship's friends having made a special request that they might be allowed to attend, the request was acceded to, and the following noblemen and gentlemen were accordingly present:-

The arrangements of the funeral were carried out by Mr. R. Henly, Jnr., of Calne - the same undertaker to whom the funeral of the late Marquis's father was entrusted.

Fitzmaurice, and her daughter, Lady Emily Fitzmaurice, will, we understand, remain at Bowood for a short time; her ladyship's father and mother (the Count and Countess de Flahault) and the Honorable Miss Georgina Flahault (Lady Lansdowne's only sister) also remain with the Marchioness until her departure.
