The 5th of April 92. My Lady Dorothy Long pd to the Church-wardens & Overseers of Draycot Cerne the sume of five pounds for the use of the poore of Draycot Cerne being money forfeited for burieing Sir James Long Bar. & Sir Rob. Long Bar. contrary to the Act of parlmt. for burieing in woollen only.

September 17th 1752

The New Scarlet Pulpit- Cloth Cushion Fringe &c. were given to yer Church by ye Right Honourable Lady Emma

1765

Memorandum

Sir Robt. Long paid two pounds ten shillings this twenty fourth day of June 1765 to ye church-wardens & Overseers of Draycot Cerne for not burying Lady Long his Mother in Woollen only.

1767

Memorandum

The 28th February 1767 Sir James Long Bart. Paid to ye Church-wardens & Overseers of Draycot Cerne ye some of two pounds ten shillings being money forfeited for burying Sir Robt. Long Bart. contrary to ye Act of Parliamt. for burying in Woolen only.

1781

Mem

Sir James Tyley Long paid two pounds ten shillings yjis fifth day of July 1781 to the Church-wardens & Overseers of Draycot Cerne for not burying Mrs Rachel Long in Woollen.
