

## **Church History Lecture**

On Thursday night in last week the second of a course of Church History Lectures, illustrated by a lantern, was given by the Rev. W. A. Taylor in the school-room. The first lecture was on the founding of the diocese of Salisbury, and was illustrated by beautiful slides of Salisbury Cathedral. The second covered the times of Archbishop Theodore, when all the Christian Missions in the Saxon Kingdoms were united and the church was brought into shape and harmony under the rule of Canterbury. The first general council of the Church of England was held at Hertford, A. D. 673, and was attended by all the English Bishops.

The night was very stormy, but in spite of this the room was well filled with an attentive and interested audience. Mr. Miles undertook the task of manipulating the lantern.
