#### **Parish Council News**

The current PC will disband in May as the local Council Elections get underway. In another part of the newsletter the Editor has given information on how you might go about being elected to the Council if you wish to become more involved in village life. On behalf of the Chairman I would like to thank the existing councillors for their work over the last few years. Council business can sometimes be difficult and sensitive, especially around emotive planning issues, but these are always handled professionally by the current Council members. PC meetings are always fun to attend and we have our current Chairman Tim Hyde to thank for this. Tim brings his amiable level-headed approach to business and is well supported by Vice-Chairman Neil Southerden.

The PC is about to put out to tender for the work needed to maintain our woodland, common lands and Knoyle House playground. If you would like to tender for any of this work please ask the Clerk for details of the work involved. In early March work got underway to improve the view from the Windmill across the Vale and Leo Tandoh Tree Services will be undertaking the work. This year Leo will be purchasing some of the timber from the PC, but after the work is complete residents can collect felled timber for their own use. Many thanks to lan Gurney for his enthusiastic clearance work in the woods around Underhill and The Green. Ian is part of the Common Land's sub committee and has cleared many paths and bridleways that were becoming difficult to negotiate.

#### **PC Highways Report**

There has been a succession of repairs and resurfacing carried out over recent weeks as follows

- ◆ Church Road between The Shop and Church ◆
- Church Road outside Cemetery
- East of The Green between Swainscombe and The Green Farmhouse
- ◆ Touchorne Lane Jet patched between Haddon House and Manor Farmhouse
- Touchorne Lane resurfaced at the Wise Lane 
  junction.
- Wise Lane Potholes repaired approaching Clouds Crossroads
- New Road/Touchorne Lane Junction
- New Road outside The Homestead
- Sutton Bottom
- Shaftesbury Road
- Millbrook Lane (across the A350)

Just to give you an idea of timescale all the above have taken between 6 and 10 months to get the work completed after being reported.

In addition, numerous signposts have been repaired and replaced and we finally have two brand new bollards on the A350 at the Hindon Road crossing installed.

There is a programme of repainting some of the worn white lines at many junctions around the village and further afield some of which have already been carried out and I think that in general the state of the roads across the Parish is significantly better now that it was 12 months ago, which reflects the effort that is now being put in to bring our highways up to scratch by the PC.

We have a monthly visit from our Parish Steward (Fred Winter) who carries out a lot of repairs that don't require a Highways team. Fred is given jobs in advance by me each month and this new service is now working very well. He tends to do more of the smaller jobs but the advantage is that I have direct access to him and now meet with him on each visit to us to make best use of his time with us.

Everything Highways related throughout the Parish continues to be monitored regularly including the extremities with priority always given to those areas that are in poorest repair or cause a safety issue with the PC being updated on progress at each of our monthly meetings. Wise Lane through The Green to Upton is one of the current priorities along with Upton itself and Underhill as these are currently the worse sections of road in the Village. East of The Green has just been repaired and pressure will continue to be applied to Highways to get these outstanding service requests completed

  - a. You are, and will continue to be, registered as a local government elector for the parish in which you wish to stand from the day of your nomination onwards
  - b. You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish area during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of the election
  - c. Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of the election has been in the parish area
- d. You have lived in the parish area or within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of the election



All of us will experience musculoskeletal aches and pains at some point. Sadly these become more common as we age and things start to wear out.

There is a lot we can do to reduce these symptoms. Many of you have your favourite action plans – special family remedies and expert help from osteopaths, chiropractors or physiotherapists with exercises tailored to your own needs. We are very lucky to have many excellent local practitioners, as well as access to the Council's Health Trainer scheme and the new Nadder Centre in Tisbury.

Arthritis Research UK is an excellent charity with masses of information on their website (www.arthritisresearchuk.org). They have just produced a new series of information and exercise sheets that you can download.

The message is that exercise is safe and has many benefits. It eases stiffness and improves flexibility. It prevents loss of muscle strength. It releases endorphins which makes you feel good and act as natural pain killers (without the side effects of pills which tend to stop working if used too long). It helps manage body weight and reduces the strain on your joints. As we get older all of these benefits also reduce the risk of falling and breaking bones, and weight loss reduces the risk of cancer, diabetes, heart attacks, strokes and high blood pressure.

We should all aim to do 30 minutes of exercise five times a week – enough to feel you have done something, stretched out your muscles and increased your heart rate. You don't need any fancy equipment but often doing this with others helps with motivation. You could walk with a friend, join a sports club or go to the gym or swimming pool. Your surgery can refer you to the council Active Health scheme, may have some leaflets for local walks (Hindon) and the details for you to self-refer to the Health Trainer.

We look forward to seeing you out and about – we are lucky to live in some of the most beautiful countryside in England and can combine enjoying it and improving our health at the same time.

## East Knoyle Rainfall Rainfall recorded

January 76mm (2.99") February 46.5mm (1.83")

In previous Januarys the average rainfall was 3.81", so this Januarys' was just under an inch less than average. I recorded rainfall on 12 days in January, and there was a period of 9 consecutive days without recordable rainfall.

In previous Februarys the average rainfall was 3.02", so this Februarys' was only 60% of the average for the last 23 Februarys. Similarly I only recorded rainfall on 12 days in February, and there was one period of 5 days and one period of 4 consecutive days without recordable rainfall.

The main problem areas continue to be the main exit and entry roads to the village, and the stretch of the B3089 from the traffic lights on the A350 to Willoughby Hedge. Most internal village roads are quite clear of litter and this is thanks to the many residents who regularly collect litter whilst out walking. #### **RBL Branch News**

The year has started well with several pieces of positive news. On 14 January the Chairman, Branch Secretary and Standard Bearer represented the Branch at the RBL Wiltshire County Conference in Trowbridge, at which they were delighted to receive the Stillwell Cup for being adjudged the most 'Efficient Small Branch in Wiltshire'. After being 'runner up' or 'highly commended' for many years it was great to finally achieve the coveted 'Number 1' spot against ever growing and stronger competition from other Branches.

The title of 'Most Efficient Branch' is, in a way, a bit of a misnomer as you are judged on performance across many categories of activity' These include:
Administration; Remembrance;
Community Engagement;
Fundraising and Publicity, to which everyone in the Branch - and those in the village who support the Poppy Appeal - makes a valuable contribution.
So 'well done all'.

All in all there was a positive air about the conference, with National Chairman Terry Whittles outlining the RBL national strate-



gy for the next five years and revisiting successful campaigns and welfare provision over the past year. Details of the new strategy are far ranging and will be available in full later this month. Recent campaign successes include the 'Mesothelioma Campaign' supporting service men that have contracted the disease (a Cancer linked to Asbestos) through their service in tanks or ship's boiler rooms. Previously, their State Benefits were capped at just £30,000 compared to £130,000 for civilians. Following representation by the RBL they are now are entitled to claim a lump sum of £140,000 - a perfect example of why the RBL is needed and should be supported.

Another piece of good news was in regard to the war memorial in St. Leonard's churchyard in Semley. Our Branch has been working since December 2013 to have repairs to the memorial carried out by 'signposting' available funding streams and, with help from the late Jan Oliver, providing historical information to support a funding application submitted in 2016 by Sedgehill and Semley Parish Council. Finally the news has come through that the funds have been approved, subject to certain conditions, which will cover the cost of replacing the damaged base stones and highlighting the names of the 'Fallen'.

Future social events currently under consideration include a visit to the Submarine Museum in Gosport and the Maltings in Warminster. As always, guests and non-members are very welcome. Give me a call on the number below if you are interested in attending.



#### St Mary's Church

As I write this report I am preparing pancakes for Shrove Tuesday! The following day, Ash Wednesday, is the start of the Church's reflective period of Lent, leading up to Palm Sunday, Holy Week, Good Friday, then the glorious celebrations of Easter Day. The topic for the Lent Study this year is 'Receiving Christ'. 

#### **Knoyle Knature Notes**




