

## Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Easton Grey



**EASTON GREY** is a village and parish in the Hundred of Chippenham, Malmesbury Union, North Wilts, from which it lies about 9  $\frac{1}{2}$  miles north-west, 4 west-by-north from Malmesbury, and about 5 south from Tetbury. The living is a rectory, valued at £300, in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, and the property of the present incumbent, the Rev. William S. Birch, M.A. The church, a modern structure, was rebuilt, excepting the tower, in 1836. There are some Roman remains in this parish. One station is on the Roman road, at White Walls, and the other near Bransdown Hill; and Pinkney Twalley is  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles east; and Foss, half a mile south-east. Mrs. Smith is lady of the manor. Population, 189; acres, 1,014.
