Garsdon



Garsdon is a scattered village and parish within the parliamentary borough of Malmesbury, in the Northern division of the county, hundred, union and county court district of Malmesbury, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, archdeaconry of Bristol, and rural deanery of Malmesbury North, 4½ miles west from Minety station, and 2¼ north-east from Malmesbury.

The church of All Saints is in good repair, pleasantly situated on an eminence. It consists of chancel, nave, with porch, and a square embattled tower containing 5 bells. In the chancel is a monumental slab to Sir Lawrence Washington, Knt., (ancestor of the celebrated George Washington, the American patriot), who was buried here in 1643. The register dates from 1737. The living is a rectory, with the vicarage of Lea annexed, joint yearly value, including the glebe lands, £441, in the patronage of John W Gale, esq., and held by the Rev. Henry Gale, LL.D., of Trinity Hall, Cambridge.

The Primitive Methodists have a chapel here. Drain tiles are made here. In this parish is an old mansion, formerly the residence of the Earl Ferrers.

The Earl of Suffolk and Berkshire is lord of the manor and the principal landowner.

The soil is various. The chief crops are wheat, barley and roots.

The area is 1,137 acres; rateable value, £1,600; the population in 1871 was 203.
