

Post Office Directory Extract 1855



Great Bedwyn

Great Bedwin - is township, parish, and very small market town, in Kinwardstone Hundred, Hungerford Union, South Wilts., completely surrounded by forest and woodland, situated 7 miles south-east of Marlborough, 5 southwest of Hungerford, 66 from London, containing a population of 2,193. The acreage is 9,599 belonging, with the exception of about 2,008 acres, to the Marquis of Ailesbury. There is an old-fashioned market-house, now not used; the corn market, for samples is held at the Three Tuns Inn every Tuesday; there is a pleasure fair on the 26th and 27th of July. The Kennet and Avon canal runs through the north-east part, over which a bridge is thrown. The tithings of **Crofton, Marton, Wexcombe, East and West Grafton, and Wilton** are included in this parish. **Tottenham Park**, the seat of the Marquis of Ailesbury and Lord Bruce, and **Savernake**, the seat of the Hon. Charles B., Bruce are in this locality, surrounded by the forest and plantations extending for many miles abounding with deer and game. The church is a plain structure, principally of flint, with square tower. The living is a vicarage, in the patronage of the Marquis of Ailesbury, value £212, and incumbency of the Rev. William Collings Lukis, M.A. There is a National school well supported, and Cox's Charity, a small endowment. **Wolf Hall,** the birthplace of the Seymour family, is 2 miles south-west.

Wansdyke passes through the parish. Crofton is 1½ miles south-west; Brook Street, half a mile east; Broll, half a mile south-east; Folly, 1 mile south-east; Castle Hill, 1½ miles south; Harding, 2 miles south-east; Wilton, 2½ miles south; Sutton, 3 miles south-west; Dufley, 2½ miles south-west; Steep Green, 3 miles south-west; Stoke 1 mile west; Combreach, 2 miles north-west; Knowle, 3 miles north-west; Haws Hill, 2 miles north-west; Leigh Hill, 3 miles west.
