

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Great Cheverell



GREAT CHEVERELL, is a township and parish in the Hundred of Swanborough, Devizes Union, 7 miles north-east from Westbury, and 2½ west from Market Lavington, contained in 1851, 526 inhabitants, and 1.873 acres of land. The living is a rectory, in the archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury, of the annual value of £353, and in the patronage of the incumbent, the Rev. Robert Moulton Atkinson, M.A. The church of St. Peter is an ancient structure, with a square embattled tower. A Free school is endowed with a tenement and land producing an annual income of £7 10s.

POST OFFICE - Joseph Dutch, receiver, Great Cheverell. Letters from Westbury arrive at ½ past 10 a.m.; dispatched at 4 p.m. The nearest money order office is at Westbury.
