Sir Audley Neeld's Bequests

Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Audley Dallas Neeld, Bart., D.L., MVO., C.B., of the 2nd Life Guards, of Grittleton, High Sherriff of Wiltshire in 1905, and for many years Chairman of the Beaufort Hunt Committee, who died on 1 May last, aged 92 years, left estate of gross value of £152,404 with net personalty of £151,137, "so far as the present can be ascertained" Captain Robert Crespigny Gwynedd Vivian of Grittleton, nephew the Rev. Edward Alexander Gowring of the Rectory Grittleton, and Mr. Alfred Thomas Routledge of Chippenham, are executors.

Testator left £200 to his valet, Edward Cook; £100 and three months' wages to George Moore, £100 to John Pitts, gardener; £100 to F. W. Matthews, chauffeur; three months wages to servants of three years' service; £100 each to Evelyn Mary Wroughton (sister) and his nephew Audley Lionel Willis; £200 to his nieces Muriel and Violet B. M. Wroughton; £150 each to Rev. A. Gowring and Alfred T. Routledge; and the residue of the property to his nephew R. C. G. Vivian.
