Commander was Colonel Sir George Herbert, Bart, T.D. Died suddenly 29 January 1942. Replaced by Major G. M. Atkinson.

2nd in Command was Major S. T. Grigg, joined Regular Army February 1941. Replaced by Major G. M. Atkinson, D.S.O. Became Commander and was replaced 1 February 1942 by Brigadier General R. F. Hobbs, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O
