A desirable ESTATE, situate and being at Little Hinton, in the county of Wilts, now in the occupation of **Mrs. Woodward**; consisting of a farm house, with convenient barns, stables, and other out houses; yards gardens, and several parcels of arable, meadow, and pasture land, adjoining or lying near to the Homestead, containing together sixty three acres, two roods, and fourteen poles; also three inclosures of arable land, lying near Hinton Marsh Lane, containing twenty six acres, one rood, and twenty three poles; three closes of rich meadow ground, called great Marsh, Week Close, and Parker's Mead, containing twenty six acres, three roods, and twenty three poles; and also the first crop of meadow land, in the Town Mead, Inmead, and Bitland containing twenty two acres, two roods, and twenty three poles.
