## *Market Lavington 1800-1849*

**1823**

Committed to the Old Bridewell, Devizes William Ellis, charged with stealing 8 fowls and a willow basket, the property of Mr. William. Smith, of Market Lavington. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 11 August 1823**

**1833**

Committed to the Old Bridewell, Devizes Thomas Carter and William Asher, charged with stealing 6 quartern loaves, the property of John Gauntelett of Market Lavington **Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, 21 November 1833**

**1846**

John Potter was fined 40s. (including costs) for assaulting Jacob Giddings of Market Lavington. A quarrel, it appeared, had arisen out of a pig-dealing transaction, in which Potter thought that the complainant had taken advantage of him, and shewed his resentment by using his fists. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 19 March 1846**

For Trial William Godden, charged with stealing one gallon of peas, the property of James Beaven at Market Lavington **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 16 April 1846**

**1847**

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes. Thomas Mead, for one month, for leaving his family chargeable to the parish of Market Lavington. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 23 September 1847**
