

Kellys Directory of Wiltshire Extract 1911 Milton Lilbourne



Milton Lilborne is a parish, 2 ½ miles east from Pewsey station on the Great Western railway, and 7 south from Marlborough, in the Eastern division of the county, hundred of Kinwardstone, Ludgershall and Pewsey petty sessional division, union of Pewsey, Marlborough county court district, rural deanery of Marlborough (Pewsey portion), archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury. The Kennet and Avon canal passes through the northern portion of the parish at New Mill. The church of St. Peter is an ancient building of stone and dating originally from the 11th century, but now chiefly in the Early English style and consisting of chancel, nave with four bays, north aisle, south porch and an embattled western tower with pinnacles, containing 6 bells; the chancel was restored in 1864 and the whole church in 1875 at a cost of £845, under the direction of the late Mr. J. L. Pearson R.A. when the founder's tomb was discovered in the north aisle: the church has 300 sittings. The register dates from 1686. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £180, including 18 acres of glebe land and residence, in the gift of Mrs. Gale, of Weston, Bath, and held since 1908 by the Rev. John Irwin Browne Cockin M.A. of Queens College, Oxford. Here is a Wesleyan chapel, built about 1854, and seating 50 persons. Near Milton Hill is a large tumulus. Fyfield Manor House, the property of Charles Penruddocke esq., is an ancient mansion in the Elizabethan style: Charles I once stayed at this house one night on his way to Newbury. Charles Penruddocke esq. D.L., J.P. of Compton Park, Salisbury, who is the owner of Fyfield manor, the Marquess of Ailesbury, the trustees of the Somerset Hospital, Froxfield, Sir Francis E. G. Astley-Corbett bart. D.L., J.P. of 45 Cadogan Gardens, London S.W., Mark Jeans, Edward Baverstock Merriman, James Smith Haines and George Ferris esqs. are the principal landowners. The soil is sand and clay; subsoil, chalk and gravel. The chief crops are corn, roots and pasture land. The area is 3,502 acres; rateable value, £3,913; the population in 1902 was 532.

Clench is a tithing, 2 miles north; Fyfield is a tithing, 1 mile west; the hamlet of New Mill is 1 mile north; the hamlet of Little Salisbury, half a mile west.

Parish clerk - Charles Stagg.

The School Board, formed in 1876, was dissolved by the Education Act of 1902, and the school is now controlled by a Board of Managers.

Elementary School (mixed), built in 1876, for 92 children; average attendance, 70; John Lane, master.
