

Lucy's Marlborough Directory Extract 1897 Milton Lilbourne



Milton, or Milton Lilbourne, 7 miles from Marlborough, 2 Pewsey, and 14 Devizes, is a village and parish in the Eastern division of Wilts, and includes the tithings of Fifield and Clench. The hills south of the village have many indications of occupation by ancient Britons. There is a compact little village overlooking Fifield Farm, and there are a number of tumuli on Fifield Heath. At Broomsgrove, under Clench Hill, some British kilns were brought to light by men while digging stones. The kilns were explored by Mr. B. Cunnington, F.S.A., and described by him in the Wilts Archaeological Magazine. The church of St. Peter is a very ancient Gothic building, supposed to have been erected in the tenth century; it consists of chancel, nave, north aisle, with a square tower containing six bells; it was completely restored in 1875, the cost being defrayed by voluntary contributions. The living is a vicarage held by the Rev. C. F. Sweet. The Wesleyans have a chapel here. The area is 3502 acres. Milton Hill is 782 feet above the sea. Population in 1891 was 590.
