I give and bequeath unto my Son John one Guinea and all the rest residue and remainder of my real and personal Estate of what nature or kind so ever or wheresoever I give grant devise and bequeath in manner and form following (that is to say) Two fifths thereof to my Daughter Anne Daniels of Purton in the County of Wilts and to Jane Selsby of Lidiard in the County of Wilts Betty Middlecote otherwise Middlecot of Minety in the County of Gloucester Martha Price of Lidiard in the

County of Wilts Fanny Poole of Minety in the County of Gloucester one fifth each but if it should happen that either of my Daughters should depart this life before they come into possession of their respective shares then the share or proportion to which she would have been entitled to shall be equally divided among her or them surviving in equal shares and portions
And I do hereby appoint John Brown and Thomas Brown of Minety aforesaid Executors of this my Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all former and other Wills by me at any time heretofore made and do hereby declare this to be my last Will and Testament set my hand and seal this 19 th day of October in the year of our One thousand eight hundred and twenty four
