Of the 1841 population total 415 were born within the county of Wiltshire leaving 66 migrants. Further breakdown of the figures shows that 107 of the total were male under the age of 20 and 101 female leaving 138 males over 20 and 135 female.

In 1891-94 males and 120 females a total of 214 had not been born in the parish. There were 77 married men and 12 widowers; also 76 wives (one must have been away from home on the census night) and 29 widows.
