Nunton & Bodenham 1850-1899

1855

County Petty Sessions – Tuesday, Before J. H. Jacob, and W. E. Matcham, Esqrs. Henry Arney, charged with getting drunk and neglecting the employment of his master, John Read, of Nunton, was ordered to pay the expenses of the hearing, and subject himself to the abatement of a week's wages. County Petty Sessions – Tuesday Present; Viscount Folkestone, General Buckley, M.P., T. E. Fowle, Esq., Major Heathcote, E. Antrobus, Esq., M.P., W. E. Matcham, Esq., R.A. Ferryman, Esq., E Everett, Esq., J.H.C. Wyndham, Esq. Samuel Pratt and George Steele were summoned by General Buckley, M.P., for furious driving at Nunton, and fined 20s. each and costs, or 21 days' imprisonment. The gallant General complained that the policeman formerly residing at Nunton had been removed to Downton, and said he had written to Captain Meredith on the subject. But for the absence of a policeman this case might not have occurred. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday 4 September 1858
