

# Extracts from Nunton Parish Register

#### **Affidavits**

William Green, Vicar of Britford and Burford. This is the same place. He also appears to be the Rector of Little Langford.

#### 1681

Churchwarden: Thomas Luke.

#### 1681/82

Two Stillborn Children of John Russell were bruied about the 3rd of January recd.noe Affidtt. from any one of his Maties. Justices of the peace that the said children were buried in woollon and notified the same by Rowland Welsteed Jan. 14th to Thomas Luke Church Warden.

## 1682

Overseer: Leonard White.

## 1682/83

A female child of Margaret Pressy who she murdered (as it was supposed) was buried January the first & recd. an Affidtt from Justice of the peace that the sayd child was buried in woollen & notified the same to Leonard White one of the overseers of Nunton by Rowland Welsteed Jan. ye 15<sup>th</sup>..

## 1703

Edith Whheler Aunt of the foresaid Edith Wheeler, being a Virgin of about Eighty years of Age and comonly called Aunt Eed was buried the 12 April.

# 1749

Parish Register register change to "Nunton & Bodenham".

## 1759

Joseph Newman, Clerk of this Parish (by whose negligence some deficiences in this register are owing) was buried Dec 4 & William Sievier the younger was appointed by the Rev. Mr Webb to succeed him.

## 1764

Martha (only daughter of Mr. Jonathan & Martha Clark) & Wife of William Batt Esq. Ethe elder departed this Life Sept. 17<sup>th</sup> & was buried in the center of the area within the Rails of the Chancel of Nunton Church the 21<sup>st</sup>:- much regretted by her Family, fiends & poor neighbours.

# 1765

Martha Wife of Pery Buckley Esq. of Winkfield Place Berks, Relict of Richard Bingham Esq. of Binghams Melcome Dorset and Daughter of William & Martha Batt departed this life at her Brother's house at New Hall in this Parish Feb 23rd and was buried in Nunton Church on 28<sup>th</sup>

# 1771

Peter ... alias Peter Shatter a foundling about 12 years old was baprized Sept 24th. He was afterwards sent by Ld. Radnor to the Marine Society.

#### 1778

William Sievier was buried May 9th. He was Clerk to this Parish, which duty he performed with diligence & ability & throughout his life was a rare example of honesty, fidelity & industry. He who writes this knew him from his youth and laments his loss.
