

Kellys Directory Extract 1915 Nunton with Bodenham



NUNTON with **BODENHAM** forms a parish, 3 miles south-east-by-south from Salisbury, in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Downton, petty sessional division of Salisbury and Amesbury, Salisbury union and county court district, rural deanery of Wilton, archdeaconry of Sarum, and diocese of Salisbury. The river Chalke here falls into the Avon. The church of St Andrew is an edifice of flint and stone in mixed styles, but almost wholly rebuilt in1855, and consists of chancel, nave of four bays, south aisle, south porch, and a low embattled tower containing 3 bells; there are 150 sittings. The register dates from the year 1620. Nunton is a chapelry of the vicarage of Downton. There is a Baptist chapel erected in 1860, in Bodenham. The Radnor Hall reading rooms were built in 1893 at the expense of the 5th Earl of Radnor, for the benefit of the workmen on the estate. The Earl of Radnor, who is lord of the manor, and Major Buckley, are the principal landowners. The soil is gravel and chalk; subsoil chalk. The chief crops are wheat and barley and some land in pasture. The area is 1215 acres; rateable value £1434: the population in 1911 was 285.
