Nunton



NUNTON, a township and parish in the Hundred of Downton and Alderbury Union, South Wilts, distant 3½ miles south-east-by-south from Salisbury, and 98½ from London. The living is a perpetual curacy, united with that of Bodenham; the Rev. Richard Payne, B.C.L., is the incumbent. NEW HALL, in this parish, is the seat of Major-General Buckley. Here is a place of worship for Baptists, and a small National school. Population, in 1851, 276.

BODENHAM is united with Nunton township.
