Hugh Spencer Lisle Dundas and Enid Rosamund Lawrence

The marriage took place at St Martin's-in-the-Field, London, on Saturday, of Mr Hugh Spencer Lisle Dundas, DEO, DFC, son of Mr and Mrs Frederick Dundas, of Cawthorne, near Barnsley, and the Hon Enid Rosamund Lawrence, second daughter of Lord and Lady Oaksey, of Hill Farm, Oaksey, near Cirencester.

The Bishop of Gloucester, Dr C S Woodward, officiated assisted by the Rev M L Charles-Edwards, Vicar of St Martin's-in-the-Field, and the Rev S J Titterton, Rector of Oaksey.

The bride, who was given away by her father, wore a gown of heavy ivory duchess satin with long tuile veil held in place with a wreath of orange blossom, which was worn by her grandmother. She carried a bouquet of arum lilies.

Three little pages, four child bridesmaids and four grown-up bridesmaids attended her. The pages were Andrew Muir (nephew of the bridegroom), Timothy Begg (cousin of the bride), and Michael Fass (her godson). They wore kilts of the Dundas tartan, and sporrans and white satin shirts with lace cravats.

The child bridesmaids were Phyllida Barstow (cousin of the bride), Margaret Muir (niece of the bridegroom), Lavinia King and Camilla Bethell. All wore white net frocks with little puff sleeves and pale blue velvet sashes. Their headdresses were of white net pale ribbon and sprays of lilies of the valley. They carried bouquets of mixed white flowers.

The grown up bridesmaids were the Hon Jennifer Lawrence (sister of the bride), Miss Charmain Dundas (sister of the bridegroom), and Miss Judy Rutherford and Miss Janet Rutherford (cousins of the bride). They wore long white net dresses, short sleeves and long white gloves, headdresses of white net blue ribbon and spray of lilies of the valley. They carried bouquets of white tulips and freesias.

The best man was the Hon Luke White.

After the ceremony, a reception was held at Niblett Hall, Inner Temple.
