## **Transcription**

This is the Last Will and Testament of me John Holtham of Oaksey in the County of Wilts Yeoman which I make publish and declare in manner following being of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding (blessed be God for the same) whereby after humbly surrendering my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and committing my Body to the Earth to be therein decently interred at the direction of my Executor hereinafter named I give and dispose of my Worldly Estate and Effects which it hath pleased God to bless me with as follows (that is to say) First I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary the Wife of Thomas Meddly one shilling to be paid her on demand I also give unto my Daughter Ann the sum of one shilling to be paid her on demand I also give and bequeath unto my Son Richard Holtham all and singular my Household Goods and Utensils of Household and Husbandry and all my Stock Cattle Money and Debts and all other my Goods Chattels and Personal Estate and Effects whatsoever or wheresoever he finding providing and allowing thereout unto his Sister Rebecca Holtham a proper Maintenance during the term of her natural life in case she do not Marry but in case she do happen to Marry or in case she and her Brother my Executor herein after named shall not agree to live together then my Will and desire is that my said Son Richard Holtham shall pay out of my Effects the sum of three shillings per week weekly and every week from the time of their separation for and during the term of her natural Life And I do hereby charge and make chargeable my said Estate and Effects with the payment thereof and with the Maintenance of her my said Daughter Rebecca in Lieu thereof And I do herby make nominate constitute and appoint my said Son Richard Holtham sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament And I do hereby desire my Cousin Thomas

This Will was proved at London the third day of July in the Year of Our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven before the Right Worshipful Peter Calvert Doctor of Laws Master Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of Richard Haltham otherwise Holtham the Son of the deceased and sole Executor named in the said Will to whom Administration was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased having been first sworn by Commission dully to administer.
