Ogbourne St. George

WITH a station on the G.W.R., Ogbourne St. George is 4 miles from Marlborough and 7 from Swindon, and is in the Devizes Division of Wilts, Union, Petty Sessional Division and County Court District of Marlborough, and Diocese of Salisbury. The register of the Church of St. George dates from the year 1664, and the living, a vicarage, net yearly value of £220, is in the gift of the Dean and Canons of Windsor. There is a Wesleyan Chapel in the village. King's College, Cambridge, are the Lords of the Manor and chief landowners. Letters arrive by cycle post from Marlborough, and are despatched at 8.40 a.m. There is a pillar box at South End, a hamlet on the road to Marlborough, cleared at 6.15 p.m., There is a Money Order and Telegraph Office in the village. Area, 3,571 acres; rateable value, £3, 423; population in 1921, 465.
