

Chimney on Fire

A serious fire was averted on Saturday evening at the West End, when Mr. H. Humphrey's chimney got alight. At 9.15 sparks were pouring from the chimney and with a strong breeze blowing these were being carried over to Mr. Kimber's thatched buildings in the farmyard. The Auxiliary Fire Brigade under their captain (Mr. E. J. Hill) were on the scene in a few minutes. In the meantime soldiers and civilians assisted inside the house in getting the fire out and at 10 o'clock it was decided that everything was safe.
