## Bankruptcy of Edward Gough 1862

Notice is hereby given, that by indenture bearing date the fifteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty two, and made between Edward Gough the younger, of Seend, in the county of Wilts, farmer, of the first part; Stiles Jefferys of Calne, in the said county of Wilts, draper, and Joseph Herbert Maggs of Melksham, in the said county of Wilts, sack manufacturer, of the second part; and the several other persons whose names and seals are thereunto subscribed and set, being respectively creditors of the said Edward Gough, the younger, of the third part, the said Edward Gough the younger conveyed and assigned all his real and personal estate and effects unto the said Stiles Jefferys and Joseph Herbert Maggs, upon trust, for the equal benefit of themselves and all other the creditors of the said Edward Gough the younger; and that such indenture was duly executed by the said Edward Gough the younger, Stiles Jefferys and Joseph Herbert Maggs, respectively, on the day of the date thereof, in the presence of, and attested by Jacob Phillips of Chippenham, in the said county, solicitor. And notice is hereby also given, that the said indenture now lies at my office in Chippenham, aforesaid, for inspection and execution by the creditors of the said Edward Gough the younger.
