FROM WHERE I STAND ...

...I just can't wait to go back! This time last month you may remember that I was struggling to pack my suitcase preparing to travel to Israel/Palestine. Just as I had imagined - this trip was no ordinary sight-seeing journey - but a pilgrimage. It was a journey that I feel I am still travelling along and from where I stand I invite you to walk with me. You may recall reading last month that a pilgrimage is more than a physical journey, the sense of travelling not only in the physical sense, but finding something rather more profound by the experience, going from one place to the next in body but also in mind and heart, also the possibility that it may be a journey nearer to God. Step this way and I'll show you what I mean.

From where I stand of course there was the big adventure of flying 2000 miles away, the pleasure of being with interesting people, the opportunity to sample wonderful food, the fun and laughter of people travelling together. There were also the great sites to visit, the holy places of such familiar names, honoured by Jew and Christian as well as Muslim. Yet from where I stood in these places came the realization that for over 2000 years it has been believed that Jesus knew this land, this town, this city, this mountain, this sea... Clearly there are places too where it is impossible to be so sure of the exact spot of Jesus' ministry but there are many more where it has been strongly held that He would have known this place.

To stand on the Mount of Olives and look into Jerusalem is what Jesus did and He looked at that city and wept for its destruction and the conflict that it would see. It is a land of conflict today. From a garden on the side of that mountain He was taken, arrested, brought to the authorities in the city and crucified. At the place where Gethsemane may have been it was very hard to avoid being touched by the place, its history and its God.

To stand in Bethlehem, the place known to be the place of Jesus' birth, the touch of the experience was just as overwhelming and yet too it is impossible to avoid being aware of the needs of its people today. Bethlehem is an open air prison through the wall that divides Israel and Palestine but it is into that land of conflict that God was pleased to be born to the world. To stand on the banks of the Sea of Galilee, confident that the shape of the hills and the lake will have altered very little since Jesus' time, was a very special time to allow Him to wash the shores of my mind and heart, to let me think and be, to allow Him to touch and heal...

So a couple of weeks in Israel/Palestine has meant far more than just the physical travelling. From where I stand I will always hold those places very close to me and allow them, with God, to speak to me...

Perhaps many of us could find time to pause like this for a 'stand and stare' moment, to allow one experience to lead us to other reflections and realisations. In that place of pausing and reflecting we can travel a long way and may begin to sense the presence of God and so be led to see Him more clearly and find ways of knowing Him more deeply.

A rich variety of experiences.

Among my special memories of Seend are the visit of the President of the Methodist Conference for a Church Anniversary, another Church Anniversary in the Methodist Church, where the preacher was Bishop Peter Hullah, assisted by Jamie, taking Family Festival Services at Holy Cross and Derek Frost taking a Methodist Communion Service in the Methodist Church - with the bishop's permission of course! Church and Chapel in Seend had a close relationship in those days.

We already know Burnham-on-Sea well having served in Weston-Super-Mare in the same Methodist Circuit and we already have a lot of friends there. If you know the area well you will understand when I say that our bungalow is less than 10 minutes walk from the beach and at least 2 miles from the sea.

God bless you all, I shall be interested to hear of future developments in the village of Seend in the years that lie ahead.

Mrs Miller goes to Tamil Nadu for 3 months every year to help and teach 88 boys. The home is run by a Christian doctor and is a very happy place.

We saw pictures of the boys, many of whom are the victims of polio, using climbing frames, and taking part in races using their sticks or crutches. Crawling races (very fast!) are held for the more seriously handicapped. The boys are obsessed with cricket and play in every spare moment. They have a large deepwater tank for all their water, but it is also used for swimming and spectacular diving!

Mrs Miller's annual visits are sponsored by the Charity, The Neem Tree Trust, and her whole family help in raising funds. Mrs Miller paid tribute to her husband who looks after the children and home in her absence.

A presentation was made to Rosemary Harding, the retiring Enrolling Member, in appreciation of her 5 1/2 years service. Elizabeth Campbell reported on a successful visit to Tewkesbury on 13th May to maintain the Deanery link with Ashton Deanery, Manchester. Many old friendships were renewed and an excellent high tea was served by the Ashchurch MU Branch.

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

The May meeting was attended by 8 Councillors.

Following the resignation of Mr Smith at the previous meeting, nominations were invited for the post of Chairman. Mr Smith nominated Mrs Joan Savage, seconded by Mrs Carr. There were no other nominations, and

Mrs Savage was elected unanimously by a show of hands. Mrs. Savage then took the Chair.

Kennet District Council have advised that the new Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005 has introduced a new set of regulations that will replace the old Dog Fouling Order 1997. This will introduce Dog Control Orders which will bring the following changes:

- 1. Powers to control fouling in areas previously not covered e.g. 60 mph limited roads
- 2. Streamlined fixed penalty fines
- 3. More flexible enforcement

The legislation also allows a wider range of controls such as dog exclusion areas and keeping dogs on leads. More information is available from the Environmental Health Department at Kennet DC, or on their website www.kennet.gov.uk

GARDEN BONFIRES -- based on information provided by the Parish Council

Very occasionally a bonfire is the best practical way of disposing of garden waste that cannot be composted, such as dry, diseased plant material etc. Considerately managed this should not cause a problem. However, during the hot summer months when windows are open and people are enjoying their gardens, bonfires can be a real nuisance.

The smoke, smuts and smell from bonfires are the subject of many complaints to the local authorities. Smoke and fumes prevent your neighbour from enjoying their gardens, opening windows or hanging out washing.. It can reduce visability in the neighbourhood and on the roads.

So before lighting a bonfire, please consider the effect it may have on your neighbours. People do not wish to shut their windows on hot, humid nights, just to keep out bonfire smoke. It may ruin the evening for a neighbour who has been stuck in a hot office all day.

If a neighbour is causing a regular problem by burning rubbish, the law is on your side. If a persistent nuisance is caused, it can be classed as a statutory nuisance under the Environmental Protection Act 1990. It is best to approach your neighbour first about the problem, but if that fails, you can

contact the Environment Officer at Kennet District Council who will investigate the matter and take action.

Bonfire Guidelines:

- 1. Only burn dry material.
- 2. Never burn household waste, tyres, plastics, foam or paint.
- 3. Avoid lighting fires in unsuitable weather conditions.
- 4. Never leave a fire unattended or left to smoulder. Douse well with water.
