

Woman Assaults Neighbour

County Petty Sessions

Tuesday. Before Mr E. Hinxman and other magistrates:

Eliza Warren, a married woman, of Damerham, was summoned for assaulting Ellen Pain, of the same place, on September 24th. The assault arose out of jealousy, defendant having reason to believe that her husband had paid complainant more attention than he ought to have done. Defendant was therefore fined in the mitigated penalty of 10s and costs. Daniel Warren, husband of the defendant in the last case, was charged with using abusive language towards George Pain, father of the first-named complainant. The evidence disclosed a low state of morality among the persons concerned. Defendant was bound over in his own recognizances in the sum of £10, and to find two sureties in £5 each, to keep the peace for six months.
