To the Editor of the Salisbury and Winchester Journal.

I think, perhaps, it may not be generally known that some of those who had the privilege of being confirmed by our dear late Bishop have conceived the idea of asking all who shared that privilege with them (as far as it is possible to reach them) to give something towards the Memorial Fund.
