STRATFORD TONEY, or STRATFORD ST. ANTHONY, is a township and parish in Cawden and Cadworth hundred, Alderbury union, Salisbury county court district, South Wilts, Wilton parliamentary borough, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and deanery of Chalke, 4 miles south-west from Salisbury; it is pleasantly situated on a branch of the river Avon. The living is a rectory, annual value £393, with residence, in the patronage of Corpus Christi College, Oxford, and held by the Rev. George Davies Kent. The church of St. Mary is a very ancient Gothic structure, with square tower and 3 bells. The earliest register bears date 1562. There is a day and Sunday school, supported by the Rev. G. D. Kent, B.D. Population, in 1851, 165, with 1,173 acres.
