In the Name of God Amen I John ffollett of Stratford Tony in the Countie of Wiltes Taylor being sicke and weake but of perfect and sound memory (thankes bee unto God) Doe make this my last Will and Testament in manner and forme followinge ffirst I bequeath my Soule unto Almightie God my Maker and to Jesus Christ my onlie Savyour and Redeemer by whose merritts I trust to bee saved onlie and with hopes at the resurrection to beholde him with these mortall eyes My bodie to bee buryed in Stratford Church or Churchyard at the discretion of my ffriends Item I give unto my Mother Marie ffollett one hundred pounds of lawfull money due unto mee upon Specialtie Item I give unto my Sister Marie Pittman ffortie pounds And to her eldest Daughter Sisilla Pittman ffortie pounds And to her youngest Daughter Anne Pittman Item I give unto my Sister Joane Blake Twentie poundes Item I give unto Joane Thistlethwaite ffyve poundes And to her Sonne ffive pounds more Item I give unto William Blake of East Harman Twentie pounds And to his fyve Children Twentie shillinges a peece Item I give unto Margarett Blake Daughter unto my Sister Joane Twentie poundes Item I give unto her Daughter Honor Blake Twentie poundes Item I give unto her Daughter Martha Blake Twentie poundes Item I give unto that parish called Chitterne where I was borne ffortie shillinges Item I give unto Jane Turner (if livinge) ffortie shillinges Item I give unto Susann Ditton ffortie shillings Item I give unto Mr George Ditton Tenn shillinges And his Three Children Tenn Shillinges each Item I give unto the poore of Barford ffortie shillinges Item I give unto Alice Turner of Barford widdow Twentie shillinges I alsoe give her Tenn shillinges more which shall be due from Anthony Addams at Michaelmas next Item I give unto the poore of Stratford Tony ffortie shillinges All the rest of my goods Cattels and Chattells whatsoever moveable and unmoveable I give and bequeath unto Thomas Pittman sonne of Richard Pittman at or neere Choote in the Countie of Southton whome I make my whole Executor of this my last Will he payinge and discharginge all expence in the tyme of my sicknes and buryall ffor Overseers of this my Will I do desire John barter and William Selwood And for their paynes therein I give them seaven shillinges a peece All these my legacies and money given and bestowed on either or anie of my sister Marie or Joane doe or shall happen to dye before they shall receave the aforesaid legacies Then the said portions shall remayne and bee paid unto the rest of their Bretheren and Sisters John ffollett Signed Sealed and delyvered in the presence of John Smythe the marke of Jane Barter
