THE COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTIONS

CORSLEY

This is the only division in the Warminster Union in which there will be a contest. The candidates are Mr W. Stratton, of Kingston Deverill, a well known agriculturist and a member of the Royal Commission on Agriculture, and Mr Isaac Dally, a carter at the Upton Lovell Cloth Mills. The former is being supported by the whole of the farmers of both political parties, but the latter is finding many supporters among the labourers, who comprise a large proportion of the constituency. Meetings have been held at nearly every village by the respective candidates, and great interest seems to be taken in the contest. The fight will probably be very close.

All the other divisions are uncontested, in both Warminster and Westbury Unions, and little interest has been manifested in either division.
