TWENTY HOURS' EXPOSURE TO THE WEATHER

A man named Joseph Beaven, of Upton Lovell, was exposed to the severe weather out in the open air for 20 hours last week. Beaven arrived at Heytesbury Station from Trowbridge by the last train on Friday night, and proceeded to walk to Upton Lovell; but suffering from rheumatism, he gave up not far from the station, and laid down behind the rick belonging to Mr S. Parker, in which position he remained until the following day, when he was discovered in the afternoon and taken to the Angel Inn, where stimulants were given him, after which he appeared not much the worse for his 20 hours' exposure to the severe weather.
