

Kelly's Directory Extract 1889 Upton Lovell



Upton Lovell (in Domesday spelt Lovel) is a parish and small village, on the banks of the Wylye, 5 ½ miles south-east from Warminster, 1 ½ south-east-by-south from Heytesbury, and 1 north-west from Codford station on the Wilts, Somerset and Weymouth branch of the Great Western railway in the Western division of the county, Heytesbury hundred, Warminster petty sessional division, union and county court district, rural deanery of Wylye Heytesbury portion, archdeaconry of Sarum and diocese of Salisbury.

The church (dedication not known but believed to be St. Peter) is a small edifice, built in mixed styles of architecture, consisting of a chancel, nave, north and south porches, and a low square tower with 3 bells: a small window in the chancel is Early Norman: on a stone in the wall over the south porch is the date 1632, which is supposed to signify the date of its restoration: the building was again restored in 1833: it will seat about 150 persons. The register dates from 1712. The living is a rectory, yearly value £325, including 25 acres of glebe with residence, in the gift of the Lord Chancellor and held since 1874 by the Rev. Herbert Frederic Crocket B.A. of Trinity College, Oxford.

There is a factory here, employing about 120 persons, in which woollen cloths are made. Col. John Frederick Everett, J.P., Mrs Ingram and T. K. Harding esq. are the principal landowners; the land is all freehold. The soil is chalky; subsoil, chalk and flint. The chief crops are wheat, oats and barley. The area is 1,400 acres; rateable value, £1,776; the population in 1881 was 207.
