Upton Lovell

THE MANOR ESTATE

Last week Messrs Waters and Rawlence, of Salisbury, offered for sale by auction at their Rooms, the Upton Lovell Manor Estate, which comprised an area of about 570 acres, and included the residence and farm buildings in the occupation of Mr Clark, who is leaving at Michaelmas next. The announcement that the property would be offered with very low reserves created considerable local interest, and a good and influential company was present, the competition, however, being solely between residents in the immediate neighbourhood. Lot 1 included the dwelling house, home and field farm buildings, five labourers' cottages and about 295 acres of Land, and was purchased by Mr Charles Notley at £3,500. Lot 2, which comprised the Down Farm, with about 194 acres of land, being bought by Mr T. K. Harding at £1, 075, who also secured Lot 8 at £400. Lots 5 and 7, two small plots of accommodation land in the village, were purchased by Mr Walker for £220. The remaining lots, comprising a freehold residence and various small parcels of water meadow land, failed to reach the reserves and were withdrawn. The solicitor was Mr Thomas Ponting, of Warminster.
